*In the Arabic language the word for desert is Sahara. The **Sahara** is so hot that temperatures of 136 degrees F have been recorded in Al Aziziyah, Libya. The Sahara can also become very cold at night because the dry desert air loses its heat very quickly. Temperatures from day to night can change by as much as 100 degrees.*
